- Students receive individual or small group intervention outside of the classroom setting; frequency and duration are in accordance with the goals specified in the ISP/IEP.
- Therapists design lesson content to specifically address identified goals and objectives set forth in the ISP/IEP.
- Students with similar goals can receive service in small groups of 3 to 5.
- Therapists provide intervention in the areas of articulation, voice, fluency, and language.
- Speech and Language professionals communicate with teachers, other interventionists, and parents to review progress and goals.



BENEFITS:

- Strengthens literacy skills, which leads to increased academic performance
- Helps students become more effective communicators, problem solvers, and decision makers
- Improves communication in the school setting and beyond
- Strengthens social skills
